ANGLETON, TEXAS

Brazoria County Seat

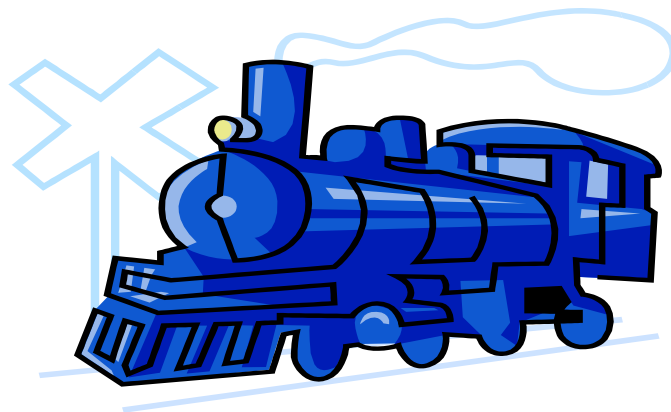
In 1890, Lewis R Bryan and Faustian Kiber purchased more than 3000 acres of prairie land and established the townsite which was to be named Angleton.

In order to insure rail service one-half interest in the townsite was donated to the Velasco Railroad Company in exchange for the construction of a depot in the community. By 1892, the town consisted of a store, post office, church, school and hotel, all built near the Velasco terminal depot.

In 1897, after a bitter county-wide political battle, the county seat was moved from Brazoria to Angleton. Downtown Angleton was always the center of activity as a result of the railroad and the county seat having been relocated to Angleton. Hotels were built to accommodate the many travelers to Angleton doing business at the county courthouse.

After the turn of the century, Angleton experienced many changes. The automobile had become a regular mode of transportation and people doing business at the courthouse no longer needed to spend the night. The hotels began to be converted to other uses as retail stores offering products to the town's residents and the surrounding areas.

Merchants and property owners put their faith and money into downtown. Downtown Angleton prospered during the 1940's and 1950's. The rail business and the county seat were instrumental in Angleton's continued growth. Today Angleton is a thriving community and the heart of "Brazoria County"
